
COVID prevention protocols

At Good Shepherd Episcopal Church, masks are no longer required, but highly encouraged. Congregants and visitors are encouraged to always have a mask available to wear when in close proximity to others; this policy is subject to change with the circumstances as necessary based on community spread.

Regarding other preventative measures:



- Vaccination remains required of all clergy and employees, as well as volunteers who participate in community ministries (meal ministries, home visitors, etc.) Vaccination is no longer required (but still encouraged) for all church volunteers (i.e. lectors).
- Anyone with covid-like symptoms, even if "just under the weather" are kindly asked to refrain from attending in-person activities until symptom-free.
- Until further notice, in worship services:
 - The passing of the peace will remain stationary,
 - The celebrant will cover the elements with a purificator while presiding over the communion elements and will wear a mask while distributing communion.
 - Communicants are to continue wearing a mask to receive the sacrament.
 - Distanced seating is encouraged, but not required.
 - Masks while greeting the priests after service are encouraged.

A MESSAGE FROM ACCW PRESIDENT

Aloha and what a busy and blessed time it has been for ACCW!

Besides continuing the Central Maui Runs, in March and April the Van joined the MMEU (the Maui Police Department Mobil Medical Educational Unit) and CORE (Critical Outreach and Response through Education) Program in Paia on Monday mornings in the Paia Municipal Parking lot. So many served! Upwards over 60+ each time.

Then in May, the MMEU and CORE program moved to Kihei on Mondays and the ACCW Van followed. But in this area, the Run teams went searching for more



unsheltered, finding old friends and meeting new ones on the streets. The wonderful MPD program planned to shift to another location in June, and the Board needed to decide whether to continue to follow the MPD folks or continue to serve Kihei on a regular basis. Realizing how consistency can be so important to developing relationships and trust on the streets, the Board decided to continue to serve Kihei.

So more news: the Kihei Runs are now on Sundays as we used to do. The Central Maui Runs have moved to Thursday mornings. Why Thursdays? Those we served were polled and on Thursdays other ministries and programs like Maui Rescue Mission, various Mental Health services, and the Salvation Army also reach out to the unsheltered and due to costs of gasoline some folks only show up on Thursdays and prefer a day when multiple services are offered. So far that transition has been smooth.

And more news! We'll be getting some more of our priests on Thursday Runs too! (I should mention Fr John Hau'oli Tomoso continues to be a dedicated volunteer!) Fr Moki Hino went on a Run Thurs June 2nd to offer prayers and Holy Communion to those who wanted them. We learned that the thirst for the Holy Spirit is equally great, if not greater, than the bodily thirst for water on the streets.

Many, many thank you's for the fantastic Supply Team who package together the snack packs and hygiene packs for the Runs; as well as sorting all the donations, folding and labeling them, organizing the Supply Room, shopping, carrying, lugging, hauling, and anything else needed to keep this ministry going. Special thanks to Ruth Eisen for the thousands (yes, really!) of q-tip packs she makes and to Jean Fiddes for the thousands (yes again!) of first-aid packs she makes. And we can't forget the Wailuku and Kahului Hongwanji Buddhists, Trinity team, and Rev Linda and Dr John Deckers for the thousands (true!) of Peanut Butter & Jelly sandwiches! (Please reach out to any of these Supply Angels if you'd like to help with these amazing "behind the scenes" ministries).

We'd love to have you join our Runs – share our tears, prayers, and sometimes laughter with those we serve. If you were a past volunteer, or thinking about riding as a guest to see what goes on – please call the ACCW phone (808) 419-1637, or my email: deblynchstudios@gmail.com, or wave me down wherever you find me, and we'll get you on a Run.

This ministry has weathered the pandemic like a small, but mighty, ship in turbulent seas, rising over waves, scary drops, but then steady as she goes. God watches over us and I believe He loves the heart we have for the ones cast aside and forgotten. As one of those we served smiled and said, "You guys are just like what I read in the Bible!"

Please pray for the ACCW ministry, and for all people suffering. There is so much sorrow in the world now – like small candles in the night, ACCW does help bring comfort.


RUBBAH SLIPPAH DONATION TO A CUP OF COLD WATER
