Dear Good Shepherd Ohana:

The days are long, the temperatures are warm, and the breezes do the best they can to keep us cool and refreshed. It's summertime in Maui and the island seems to be full of life, especially with the vast number of visitors who are with us to share in the beauty that we get to enjoy every day.

And even though many people are taking vacations and the kids are on summer break, the work of the church continues and your vestry and I continue to embrace the blessings given to us in the present as we look to our future.

While I like to focus on Sunday worship, chicken chats, sermons, and pastoral care; I also have to look at and be concerned with the financial viability of the parish, especially a parish where pledges account for only about a quarter of our income. In many other parishes, it's much higher and we are fortunate that we have the gift of land to supplement and support our mission and ministry.

The state of our commercial properties is of great concern to me and there has been a lot of deferred maintenance on them. In order to ensure income from them in the future, we are going to have to put money into upkeep, maintenance, and repairs. Brett Fahnestock, our property manager, does an excellent job of monitoring things and addressing basic repairs that need to be done in order to ensure safety for our tenants and their clients. We are truly blessed to have income from these properties.

We also are blessed to have income from McDonald's. Their lease is up in 2024 and they would

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Here is a short note from your Senior Warden; it is August and summer is coming to a close. Back in the last century (I can truly say that...), August was the last month of vacation before heading back to school after Labor Day. Now it is the start of the school year and with all the post pandemic confusion as to go in person or stay online, get vaccinated or not, mask or no mask, along with the tasks of teachers to teach and students to learn.

For the rest of us there is the choice to work remotely or return to the office, when and where to travel and how to navigate the maze like to renew. At the same time, their current footprint on our premises is not adequate to serve their needs and they have asked us to consider providing them with extra space for parking and an additional drive-through



lane on our office courtyard. I have begun a process for looking into this, bearing in mind that part of the office building would have to come down. I also bear in mind that at the current time our office building generates zero income. In discussions with McDonald's, I have insisted on two things. The first is that we keep the monkey pod tree. The second is that we keep St. John's, St. Luke's, and St. Mark's up and available for our Sunday school and our outreach ministries (the Queen Emma Athletic Club and A Cup of Cold Water). Please bear in mind that this is an initial inroad and conversation and I promise you that the vestry and I will keep you informed as things progress and before any major and permanent decisions are made.

In the meantime, I ask your prayers for the continued viability of our congregation for our worshiping community in the wider community of Wailuku. Good Shepherd is a very special place with very special people and I continue to be very grateful that I am here with all of you.

#### Aloha All!

Dogs barking, dusty feet, dark eyes frightened, timid smiles – the Van door slides open like a welcome door of hope. Cold water bottles wiped on hot foreheads, grungy bandanas knotted around wounds as an ACCW volunteer gently gives a food and hygiene pack to the gnarled, outstretched hand and asks, "Would you like a towel?"

"Oh yes, please, please. Thank you." Their eyes tear up, "You all are so kind. I couldn't survive out here without you."

Yes, ACCW is dearly loved. And it is true – ACCW really does help people survive on the streets. There is no emergency shelter here on Maui. Nowhere for someone just discharged from the hospital with a broken arm, bandages falling off festering wounds, limping without shoes, to go and rest for a few days. Hiding in bushes, sleeping on sharp rocks, mosquitoes and centipedes slithering – this is where they must go.

NPR had a brief talk discussing emotional doldrums lingering for some people from the pandemic and one of the cures is to go help others. Hmm ... it isn't the water, or food, or hygiene – it's God's love we share – we share compassion, we listen ... our hearts listen ... And we are lifted up.

But – we can't dismiss the PB&J sandwiches! Thank you SO much Rev Linda and Dr John Decker and the Wailuku and Kahului Hongwanji Missions! If anyone wants to make PB&J for ACCW – the Decker's have a great secret recipe they're happy to share!
