Message from our President, Deb Lynch

January 2022 brings us to a start of a new year, but also brings a surge in covid-19 cases. Another challenge, but we carry on with your love and God's guidance.

There was a Christmas Day Run IN 2021, and the ACCW Board decided to continue with Christmas Day Runs in the future even if it falls on a non-usual Run day. We served 51 very grateful souls and many thanks to the ECM at Good Shepherd Church for providing many hygiene packs to hand out, as well as donations from others of candy, cookies and fruit.



Sadly, the Sunday Runs have stopped for now due to a lack of volunteers– but you can help! If we can get 2 more Rider volunteers who can commit to one Sunday on a regular basis (we have 2 already – we need 4-5 at least), Sunday Runs can begin again. Please consider joining a fun time, sharing God's love.

ACCW is truly needed as it helps fill the gap between complete sorrow on the streets and getting into a shelter. There isn't an emergency shelter here on Maui and the existing shelters, though working hard to help, are often constrained by their government grantors as to who is, and isn't, eligible for their services, leaving many forlorn and wandering without help.

Thank you wonderful Buddhists and Dr John & Rev Linda Decker for the hundreds and hundreds of PB&J sandwiches you all faithfully make! And thank you everyone who has donated items, money, time, and love – it is you who keep ACCW going strong!

On one Run I served a quiet, gentle man who asked my name. In turn I asked him his, and he replied with a kind smile, "Jesus. Jesus Emmanuel." My thoughts went to Matthew 25: 35-40.

Matt 25:40 "And the King will answer and say to them, 'Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me."

In serving the lost and lonely, we serve Jesus. Thank you for all your prayers during these challenging times – that is the greatest gift for ACCW.

#### FROM ACCW JANUARY NEWSLETTER:

ACCW's President, Deb Lynch, was asked to join MMAC and advise on items pertaining to Maui County's unsheltered community and the organizations that serve it. Deb is uniquely qualified as the head of an organization who also goes out into the streets to meet and serve the unsheltered people. Deb also works with many other organizations in synchronizing the outreach effort.

The MMAC met for its inaugural meeting on January 5th, just 21 days into the new MPD administration. The purpose of the Counsel is to build bridges of communication, understanding, trust, and transparency between diverse groups, organizations and community with the Maui Police Department.

We know Deb will serve the Counsel well and provide invaluable knowledge and coordination with Maui County's individuals who are unsheltered.

Congrats to Deb for her appointment and willingness to serve.

#### Items Needed and Requested for Donation

We are making a "call out" for the items listed below for Maui's neediest.

Items requested by those we serve:

- Backpacks (theirs often get stolen).
- Board shorts (all sizes especially small)
- Hoodie sweatshirts (large sizes best to stay warm)
- Slippers (always needed as they literally walk miles in them and they wear out)
- First aid (lots of wounds all types of first aid welcome)
- Shopping bags from places like Target, Walmart, etc (to carry multiple items)
- Light weight blankets
