Dear Fellow Good Shepherders,

Let me start with wishing all of you a very Happy New Year! We have followed the preparations of Advent with a Merry Christmas and all the wonderful holiday festivities. We enter into this new year with happiness and joy and pray that it will continue no matter what the future brings.

This time last year we began the transition of going forward without a Rector in place. The process of seeking a new one began to take shape. By midyear, a Search Committee was formed and began its task. Necessary data was collected and has been compiled to create our Parish Profile so that the call can go out to potential candidates. This should turn out to be a very interesting year. We continue the transition that will lead to a new Priest-in-Charge and join together as a functioning Congregation doing all that we do and then some.

We will also see changes in Wailuku as the redevelopment projects begin to take shape. Work on Church Street is scheduled to begin this month with work on Vineyard Street following so we need to be patient with all the construction, looking forward to beautiful, new town. Renovation on our beautiful Church will continue as well. We have been blessed with a challenge grant of \$25,000. towards the restoration of our Good Shepherd Altar window and the original workshops in Munich are still very much interested in doing the work having given us a very reasonable bid. We will continue to seek additional grants and we will be more than grateful for your kind generosity as well. May 3, 2020, will be a combined service at 8:30am for Good Shepherd Sunday. A special celebration is planned for that Sunday as our restoration project will be well under way by then.

There will also be a combined service for our annual meeting on Sunday, January 26, 2020. As part of that meeting we will be electing 3 new Vestry members, 6 delegates to October's annual Diocesan Convention, and a Junior Warden. If any of you out there feel compelled to take on any of these roles, please let it be known.

We will continue to strive through this transition and be all the more stronger because of it. A vibrant Laity equals a vibrant Church and all of us is what it takes to keep it that way.





Blessings of Creation

In January and February Roxanne Whitelight will be leading one of her favorite classes here on Maui called the Blessing of Creation. The Creation Stories that we believe in make a difference in how we live and view our place in Creation. This series will allow you to explore the creation stories that have influenced your life.

This seven-week series will focus us back to the first blessing that we all share, Creation. We will be guided by the sacred writings of the Hebrew Bible, The Gospels of John and Thomas, The Quran, the creation stories of other cultures including the Kumulipo and the "gospel"(good news) revealed through the Hubble telescope.

She will be offering the class at two location. See times and locations below. The sessions are largely stand alone so if you have to miss evenings you will be able to pick up the next session or you can attend in the other location.

The first session features a "walk through time and the cosmos" which helps each of us place ourselves in the great story of our time, the miracle of Creation. In this class everyone gets to have their own creation story, so the process is about discovery and exploration. Donations gladly accepted.

ACOLYTE *Festival* 2019

Welcomed with lunch prepared by Cindy and Keku Akana, a small group gathered on Saturday, October 12th. At a brightly decorated table, there were four acolytes, Bp Bob and Bea Fitzpatrick, the Senior Warden and two priests. Bp Bob introduced Pua, a small stuffed pig which will appear in photos of his daily rounds which will be sent to his three-year old grandson Marcus.

After lunch came some icebreaker games. The highlight was a race in which each of two teams was given a tub of ice with a t-shirt frozen into it. The team that made a dash for the microwave won: Matthew Yagin, Bp Bob, Peter Lee, and Fr Hau'oli. The team of Charlotte Freidenburg, Isaiah Lampitoc, Bea Fitzpatrick, and Mtr Linda were coldly defeated.

More formal teaching began with Fr Hau'oli pointing out the various postures we can take during worship, and how acolytes – who are particularly visible in Good Shepherd's chancel – lead other worshippers. The last game was a game of Jeopardy, in which the four contestants chose from categories such as the Bible, Saints, and the Eucharist; the grand winner, among impressive candidates, was Natasha Lau.

After a snack provided by Sharon Daniels, the acolytes vested and served at a Eucharist celebrated by the Bishop, at which he confirmed Gil Keith-Agaran and accepted Sharon's reaffirmation of her faith. A potluck supper followed.
