

A CUP OF COLD WATER UPDATE.....

As our modified (and very flexible) service to our own poor continues during this time, ACCW conducted one (1) Wednesday Central Maui Run on May 6, 2020 and three (3) supply service runs each Friday in May to the Kahului Salvation Army home base. Each Friday, the Salvation Army (SA) along with the Maui Rescue Mission shower/laundry ministry gather to serve our street poor and ACCW supplies SA with much needed food, hygiene, first aid packs and other essentials that SA and other outreach programs do not carry.

ACCW also supplied Ka Ohana Kitchen with six cases of water for their May 24th and May 31st hot meal ministry, which lead by the efforts of Junior Warden, Louise Aloy and others from the Good Shepherd Episcopal Church has continued to serve 60-90 homeless and poor every Sunday throughout the pandemic.

If any one of our ACCW volunteers or friends out there, (who may not be in any of the at risk categories and may feel safer serving in a controlled environment) have a desire to serve on one of their Ka Ohana Kitchen Teams on Sundays or has call to donate money or food directly to their weekly efforts (or better yet..create and serve with their own church/organization team!)in a very safe and controlled manner with mandated safety protocols in place, please call GSC office! And of course, ACCW is always looking for more Volunteers...especially as we slowly re start our mission runs.

Every outreach ministry of our greater community could use your help... KA OHANA Kitchen is one of the oldest shared ministries to the poor on Maui and has served thousands of hot meals (average 50-80 each Sunday) from the GSC parish hall to primarily our homeless and poor families, every Sunday for 18+ years now!....We are running a marathon to the Cross of Calvary, and the need will be even greater as the year progresses.

One of the things we have been very thankful for and what makes ACCW "special" to our street poor: is our diverse stock and supplies which are distributed to our street poor on a weekly basis for the past 7 years.....toilet paper, feminine hygiene, towels, , hand towels, clothing, tarps, sheets, back packs, socks, reading glasses, q-tips, can openers, quality first aid packs, diverse hygiene items, ponchos, jackets, rubber slippers, foot wear chilled water......Many of these items are not carried by any of the other primary outreach ministries on a regular basis.... Thus, the effort to supply the Salvation Army with some of these supplies throughout the pandemic....

Our Buddhist sisters and brothers have also been in touch with ACCW, and are on stand-by, ready, willing and able to continue their Peanut Butter and Jelly Sandwich deliveries, once things return to "full normal".


