Dear Good Shepherd Ohana:

I have just completed my tenth month as priest at Good Shepherd and I am amazed at how quickly time has flown by. To me, that means that things are exciting and that life is full. When I harken back to my first day as the new priest here, I remember how we were smack dab in the middle of the COVID-19 pandemic and how we had to cancel church on my first Sunday. It's wonderful and touching for me to look back on the last 10 months and think about and reflect upon the amazing things that we've done together, especially in terms of our virtual services. We also have the feather in our cap of a newly paved parking lot. At the same time, we have interesting and exciting challenges and opportunities ahead of us as we begin to emerge from this pandemic. Perhaps now the



time has come to begin thinking about post COVID-19 mission and ministry, what that will look like, and how we will ensure that it moves forward (including financially). We also have to ensure that our young adults are taken care of in our fold. Not long ago, I preached to you in the virtual worship service from the windmills at Olowalu where I talked about the Hokulea and how they were stuck in the doldrums for an extended period of time. In a wonderful moment of synchronicity, I saw on KGB the other day how the Hokulea was planning a trip to the doldrums – a trip that ultimately had to be canceled. I don't know much about sailing, especially sailing in double-hulled canoes; but what I do know is that it takes collaboration and team effort in order to make the boat go forward. It also requires taking a look at the boat and figuring out what resources we have on board and what needs to be fixed. The same is true for the church. Does the church of the future and its vitality mean that we are called to connect and collaborate with other congregations on Maui? Does it mean developing sister church relationships with parishes abroad? Does it mean taking a look at our land and buildings to figure out how to best use them for the glory of God? These are all questions before us and I find that they are not daunting so much as life-giving. I hope that you agree with me and that you are willing, with


