"The glory of God is humans, alive; the glory of a humanity is to behold God"

St. Irenaus. Contra Haeresis IV.20.7

For Lent, please stop dying.

Well, strictly speaking that comes with the whole being mortal gig. But the least we can do is start living.

Lent calls us to reflect, to look backward and ultimately to confess and repent, turn from ways that are not about the New Life in Christ to which we are called to live. But Lent, and spiritual disciplines and turning to Christ in a deeper and more profound way are not about living a lesser life, but rather living a fuller life that is both more human and more divine. St. Irenaus reminds us that the "...glory of God, is humanity, alive; and to truly live as a human, is to behold God"

Did you catch that?

God is most glorified when we, mere humans, are truly living, alive, thriving. And to truly feel alive, to be most human, is in those moments when we behold God. We are most alive when we worship. That is what Lent is about. If we give up something, or sacrifice something, get up early to pray more, it is only so God can rejoice in seeing us thriving and fully alive. And Lent is the invitation to do nothing less than to gaze upon God.

So, yes Lent is a penitential season, but it is not about glorying in gloominess: it has a purpose, and end. It is to strip off the things which keep us from God, and to find God and in so doing live life more fully and profoundly.

Over a 12 year period Bonnie Ware, A palliative care nurse, asked people who were dying what they regretted the most. They almost always mentioned 5 things:

- I wish I'd had the courage to live a life true to myself, not the life others expected of me.
- I wish I hadn't worked so hard.
- I wish I'd had the courage to express my feelings.
- I wish I had stayed in touch with my friends.
- I wish that I had let myself be happier.

Can you hear the echo of St. Irenaus in those words? If we live a life that beholds God we are invited to not get caught up in the mundane, to be caught up in conforming and pleasing others, but rather in pleasing God and working for the coming of the Kingdom. Work is necessary, but only insofar as it gives us what we need to be with the ones we love and provide for them. A life that is fully human feels deeply, and loves wildly and isn't afraid to show it. One of the most important words used to describe the church is "fellowship"; friendship is one of the things that makes Christian life most profound and wonderful. And perhaps most profoundly we cannot seek God and ignore what gives us Joy.

So have a Holy Lent, indeed. But remember that the purpose is to live more fully than before.

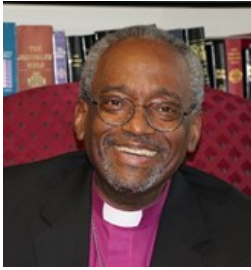
Maui Regional Confirmation

Announcement from the Primates



Before I say a word about our gathering here at the Primates Meeting, I just want to say a word of thank you to you for all of your prayers: your prayers for this meeting, your prayers for me personally, both here and in my earlier sickness. We are well, and God is God, and I thank you.

Let me say a word about the meeting. This is not the outcome we expected, and while we are disappointed, it's important to remember that the Anglican Communion is really not a matter of structure and organization. The Anglican Communion is a network of relationships that have been built on mission partnerships; relationships that are grounded in a common faith; relationships in companion diocese relationships; relationships with parish to parish across the world; relationships that are profoundly committed to serving and following the way of Jesus of Nazareth by helping the poorest of

the poor, and helping this world to be a place where no child goes to bed hungry ever. That's what the Anglican Communion is, and that Communion continues and moves forward.

This has been a disappointing time for many, and there will be heartache and pain for many, but it's important to remember that we are still part of the Anglican Communion. We are the Episcopal Church, and we are part of the Jesus Movement, and that Movement goes on, and our work goes on. And the truth is, it may be part of our vocation to help the Communion and to help many others to grow in a direction where we can realize and live the love that God has for all of us, and we can one day be a Church and a Communion where all of God's children are fully welcomed, where this is truly a house of prayer for all people. And maybe it's a part of our vocation to help that to happen. And so we must claim that high calling; claim the high calling of love and faith; love even for those with whom we disagree, and then continue, and that we will do, and we will do it together.

We are part of the Jesus Movement, and the cause of God's love in this world can never stop and will never be defeated. God love you. God bless you. And you keep the faith. And we move forward.

News from the Primates' Meeting this past week in England included the following:

A majority of Primates (chief bishops) of the Provinces (gathering of dioceses of national churches) of the Anglican Communion have stated that members of the Episcopal Church should "no longer represent us on ecumenical and interfaith bodies, should not be appointed or elected to an internal standing committee and that while participating in the internal bodies of the Anglican Communion, they will not take part in decision making on any issues pertaining to doctrine or polity." This is for a period of three years. In other words, the Episcopal Church is in being asked to again step back from the Anglican Communion.

Why? At its core, this is about our decades long conversation within the Episcopal Church and our actions over the past two decades to fully include the LGBT community in the full life of the Church including ordination and marriage. This, of course, has happened as our cultural context and our understanding of humanity has changed.

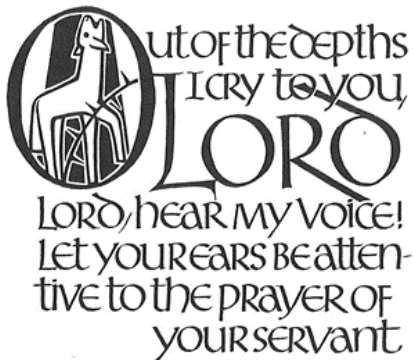
What does it mean? Frankly, I was not surprised by the outcome. It is in many ways better that I had feared. In practical terms of our mission and ministry, the Primates' statement will have very little impact.

In the early 1930s the Archbishop of York, later Archbishop of Canterbury, William Temple, proposed that we Christians apply four basic Christian principles when addressing any issues of the Christian life and morality, and social and economic justice. They are: (1) the sacredness of personality, (2) the fact of fellowship, (3) the duty of service, and (4) the power of self-sacrifice.

The sacredness of personality is the principle that affirms the value of each of us as individuals before God. The basis for this principle in our Christian life is the Incarnation of God in Jesus Christ. The Incarnational Principle affirms the sacredness of individual human persons as products of creation and the foci of redemption. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God...and the Word became flesh and dwelt among us." (John 1:1, 14) These words from John's gospel graphically express the reality of a God who lived, laughed, suffered and died within our human lives. All humanity—each of us individually—is sanctified by the mere fact of the Incarnation. We each are a sacred personality.

The second principle—the fact of fellowship—reminds us that we live in Community. This is the Pentecost Principle. There is no such thing as a natural human being: a lone wolf—especially a Christian lone wolf. One cannot be a Christian outside of the fellowship of believers. Our relationships do matter; the conduct of each of the individuals within the fellowship is the concern of the whole. We are not a collection of individuals, but a community created at Pentecost. We are responsible for one another.

Give Something Up

It is traditional to fast during Lent. You can give up a small pleasure or fast for 24 hours once a week, the purpose of which is to prepare for the feast of Easter. Some people give up small pleasures: chocolate, alcohol, desserts, meat...

Take something on

- The Daily Office. Pray the daily office – morning and evening prayer on your own. This website has the readings so you can do it online. - Read a psalm and pray at dinner every day during Lent with your family
- Read a spiritual classic or the Bible (ask Craig, Linda or Cris for ideas)

- attend the Lenten Bible Study and renewal day

Do something Green

- Change your lightbulbs to compact fluorescents, or better yet, LED's ; look into solar hot water or electricity
- start recycling.

Give to the poor, or to an organization you believe in

- A Cup of Cold Water, for example
- Make a special donation to the church

Go to Church

Every Sunday. Invite a friend, be on time! :-)

- Sing in the Choir for Lent and Easter
- talk to Ferdinand

Attend all of the Holy Week services

Maundy Thursday, Mar. 21. Foot washing service and stripping of the altar, 7:00pm

Good Friday: Mar. 22 Stations of the cross, 5:30; Good Friday Liturgy, 7:00 pm

Easter Vigil: Mar. 28, 8:00 pm, the highpoint of the liturgical year

Easter Sunday Mar. 29th 7:00 am and 9: 00 am (baptism).

• Confession

Episcopalians also practice confession. If you want you can ask to meet with Craig or Linda to hear your confession and pronounce an absolution. The sage Anglican advice on this is "all may, some should, none must."

• Give up technology

Do something with a real person instead, get into nature, take a social media fast, stop checking your phone, stop texting while driving...

- Ask if anything needs to be done around the church
- Make time for people you care about.
- Make time for people you don't care about
- Be the first to talk with someone you don't know at church.
- Practice random acts of kindness
- Forgive someone, or ask forgiveness. Call them or write them to tell them

Safeguarding God's Children Training - Maui

Saturday, April 9, 2016

11:00 AM- 2:30 PM

St. John's Episcopal Church, Kula



This training provides participants with the information they need to protect the children they know and care for in their personal lives and the ministries in which they serve.

Who needs to complete the Training? Anyone in a church is encouraged to attend the workshop, to increase the awareness of how to watch for warning signs of child abuse. However, Safeguarding God's Children is required of:

- Clergy
- Vestry and Bishop's Committee members
- Anyone (paid or volunteer) who works with children. This includes Sunday school teachers, youth group leaders, and preschool and school teachers.

What do you learn at the Training? The Diocese uses the curriculum put together by the Church Pension Fund. It describes the program as follows:

How often do I need to take the training? Safeguarding God's Children is to be taken annually, with the first time being an in-person training. Subsequent trainings can be done either in-person or via the diocese's online courses. By providing your email address when you register for the in-person training, you can then be enrolled in the diocese's online program. An email address for each individual is *required* for online renewal.

***Deadline to register is Friday, April 1, 2016,
or when the maximum number is reached.***

The third principle—the duty of service—reminds us of our collective responsibility for one another. This is the Apostleship Principle. The fact of fellowship is preserved by the duty of service.

The fourth principle—the power of self-sacrifice—reminds us that in all aspects of our lives we are, as Christians, called beyond our egotistical beings to the service of others and God. We meet self-sacrifice as a divine imperative at the foot of the cross. God in Jesus Christ gives us the living love of self-sacrifice. We are bonded to God in the sacrifice of His Son. This is the Atonement Principle.

At this point in our common life, the Episcopal Church has decided that inclusion of our sisters and brothers is important. We have therefore opened the Sacramental Rites of ordination and, at least to some extent, marriage to those previously excluded.

For the Church, it is a struggle of different applications of the "Pentecost Principle" as we are called to new and renewed ways of living out of the "Incarnational Principle." We are therefore called to continue to engage and care for those with whom we disagree (the Apostleship Principle). We must keep in mind, however, that we cannot ask others to self-sacrifice. So, for now and once again, the Episcopal Church may well bear some form of separation from aspects of the Anglican Communion as we offer welcome and inclusion in the full life of our corner of the Church. The "Atonement Principle" may be the most difficult. In this case, however, it is no great burden.

All of this shows, I think, the basic Anglican temperament that is at the core of our tradition and moves us beyond ecclesiastical structures alone. So, in the Anglican Cycle of Prayer today (see <http://www.anglicancommunion.org/resources/cycle-of-prayer/download-the-acp.aspx>), I said a
