### Dear Good Shepherd Ohana:

I simply cannot believe that we are in the last quarter of 2021, a year that has been eventful and interesting (to say the least). In spite of the various challenges that we have faced due to COVID-19, I am proud of the way that this community has stuck together and how we continue to thrive in worship, mission and ministry.

I thank you all so very much for your patience and understanding with our decision to suspend in-person worship during the month of September. It was a difficult decision to make, but I feel very strongly that it was the right one. Our numbers are increasing here in Maui and after talking with Amy Crowe, I understand that our hospital system is overwhelmed. When I asked Amy how Good Shepherd could help, she suggested providing snacks for the break rooms of the healthcare workers at the hospital and Cora delivered 15 boxes of various snack items like instant ramen, chips, granola bars, and the like. We put a sign on the boxes saying that they came with prayers and gratitude from our congregation and the snacks were much appreciated by the healthcare workers at the hospital. I plan to continue doing this until our outreach budget is spent down.

Our Gregorio Aglipay service has come and gone and it was well received not only by our congregation, but also the wider diocese and community. It was really a fun service to put together and I so appreciate how everyone stepped up to help with music, dancing, and readings. I also appreciate the video given to me by Bishop Dacuycuy from the Diocese of Batac in Ilocos Norte. She watched our entire service and suggested that I dance the tinikling next year. After having done it at my ordination, I don't think my ankles could handle it, but we shall see!

Please know that we will soon be entering our annual pledge drive and I would like to ask you to please prayerfully consider what your giving might be for the upcoming year. Like last year, and you can expect to receive a mailing sometime in the near future and I thank you in advance for your generosity.

On a personal note, I was away in Portland, Oregon in early September to attend the wedding of my younger brother, Graham. It was a small, intimate ceremony at the timberline of Mount Hood and in addition to a wonderful wedding, my brother and sister-in-law are expecting twins at the end of the year and I am going to be an uncle!

Please take care, everyone, and thank you once again for your patience and understanding about the suspension of our in-person worship in September.





# DIAL 808 TO MAKE LOCAL CALLS

A reminder, starting October 24, 2021 everyone with area code 808 must enter 808 + telephone number. This includes all Maui local calls. Anyone with an area code 808 telephone number will need to make a change from 7-digit local dialing to 10-digit local dialing.

On and after October 24, 2021, local calls dialed with only 7 digits may not be completed, and a recording will inform you that your call cannot be completed as dialed. Hang up and dial 808 + telephone number.



You will need to change all automatic dialing numbers and equipment's (life safety systems, fax machines, fire or burglar alarms, security systems, speed dialers, etc.). Be sure to check your website, personal/business stationary, personal/business checks, contact information, and other such items to ensure the area code is included.

For information on services and hotline/emergency phone numbers that will stay the same and/or and questions/more information, please contact your phone carrier.


