In the beginning of 2015, Bishop Bob forwarded 10 likely applicants to the Search Committee. The Committee diligently reviewed each ones paperwork, resumes, letters and ministry portfolios, and called their references. The committee narrowed the field to 6 possible candidates and on February 7, they arranged

Skype interviews with each of them which begun their long day at 5:00am.

The Search Committee has done a wonderful and difficult job. They have SEARCH COMMITTEE chosen and forwarded 3 promising priests to the Vestry. The Vestry' task is now to decided which one of them will be our new rector for Good Shepherd Church. The Vestry interviewed the 3 candidates again, by Skype, on February 15 and 16. They have decided which ones they will fly over to Maui to have a face to face interview.

From the Sr. Warden

Greetings fellow Good Shepherds and Shepherdesses,

As I write this, things are literally up in the air. The arrangements to bring over two candidates for our new Rector are being made. The plan is to have the candidates fly over to Maui stopping in Honolulu to meet with the Bishop on February 24 and March 3 for a short visit. On the Wednesdays of their visits (February 25 and March 4) will be a potluck pupu reception starting at 5pm to which all the Congregation is invited. At 7pm, the Candidate and the Vestry will meet for a private interview. The Vestry will then meet on Saturday, March 7 with Bishop Fitzpatrick to make the final decision and then the call. So by the time you read this we will be introducing our new Rector!

Speaking of introductions, let me introduced the two candidates: the first candidate you will meet is Rev. Craig Vance from Vancouver , Canada. He is divorced with two children, Daniel 24 and Amadea 21, both in school. He speaks several languages, enjoys music, and is actively engaged in programs with youth and young adults. The second candidate you will meet the following week is Rev. Chad McCharles. He is also Canadian and comes from Manitoba in the center of the country. He is married to Dawn and has two children, Jacob 10 and Amy Beth 8. He is also interested in music, was a professional baker and has visited Good Shepherd Church with his family in the past.

I hope that you had/have the chance to participate in these events and as I do, look forward to some exciting times ahead.



LENTEN BIBLE STUDY



"The Lamb of God"

February 20-Behold, The Lamb of God (John 1:29; Leviticus 4:32-35). A basic introduction to the Hebrew concept of sacrifice for the forgiveness of sin.

February 27-The Lamb Who Takes Our Place (Isaiah 53). We ponder the Suffering Servant who bears our sin in himself as well as the punishment due to us for sin.

March 6-The Lamb Who Redeems Us from Slavery (1 Peter 1:18-19; Mark 10:44-45; 1 Corinthians 6:19-20). We examine the concepts of ransom and redemption to set free those who are enslaved.

March 13-The Passover Lamb of Whom We Partake (1 Corinthians 5:7; Exodus 12:3-14; Matthew 26:26-30). We'll examine the Passover, the Passover lamb, and the Last Supper, in order to appreciate what we do when we partake of communion.

March 20-The Triumphant Lamb We Worship (Revelation 5:1-14). In the Book of Revelation we explore concepts of worshiping and loving the Lamb, who is now clearly the risen and reigning Christ.

All sessions will be held in the Parish Hall after the Stations of the Cross.

From The Worship Committee

To: Good Shepherd Standing Committee Chairs

Subject: Requesting Assistance to Recruiting Members for Worship Committee

According to the parish by-laws, the worship committee "shall be responsible for coordinating the various church ministries, including without limitation, acolytes, altar guild, Eucharistic ministers, Eucharistic visitors, greeters, lay readers, and music." Enclosed are some thoughts on the purpose of the worship committee from Fr Marvin Foltz.

Recently, this committee has revisited the continuing need for more diverse representation from the members of the congregation in order to better execute its responsibilities. In particular, it is in the best interest of the parish to have representatives from the Saturday service, from the early Sunday service, from a wider age range (specifically youth & young adults), and from underrepresented ministries like altar guild, eucharistic ministers, ushers, and lay readers.

We ask the assistance of the chairs of the parish's other committees in recommending people to fill the void. Please prayerfully consider who in your circle of contacts might be asked to take up the challenge. You may ask any member of the worship committee for more information. Thank you.

Thoughts from Fr Marvin Foltz on the purpose of the Worship Committee:

A congregation that is fully alive seeks for all its members to be involved in its worship life. The worship committee works with the pastor and other clergy to provide ways for all people participate in worship.

Liturgical Links

The worship committee should work from the assumption that worship is a unifying event in the life of a congregation. It is the one time when all members join together in a common purpose—to worship and thank God for God's grace given to all in Word and Sacrament. As such the worship committee should seek to enrich the understanding of the people and allow them the best opportunity to enter the worship experience. The committee should commit to deepening their understanding of the Scripture, prayer book, and the various hymnals of the church.

Communication

Because worship is at the heart of a congregation's life, the decisions made by the worship committee ultimately affect all. Effective communication is vital. Not only do decisions have to be made clear for those who must carry them out, but the committee also may need to educate those charged with worship responsibilities. The service bulletin needs make the liturgy clear and inviting for all participants. Responsibility for communication with all worship-related organizations (such as ushers, office staff, musicians, altar guild, and so forth) and other committees should be explicitly assigned to particular members and carried out efficiently.

Responsibilities

The entire committee might be responsible for the following:

visioning (based on mutual learning and involvement in the worship life of the congregation)

evaluating regular liturgies and special events

receiving feedback from the congregation

coordinating with other committees

advising those who are responsible for planning worship (the Rector is given this primary responsibility by canon)

environment and seasonal decorating

managing publicity for liturgies and other events

preparing explanatory and/or inspiring articles in the congregational newsletter about particular services and times in the church year

recruiting and training and coordinating participants for ministries, e.g. musicians, choir, handbell choir, praise and worship group, acolytes, lectors, intercessors, eucharistic ministers, flower guild, altar guild, ushers, oblationers, etc.
