Love, Liberty and Abundant Life...

There was a very wise Anglican who lived a long time ago in England named Richard Hooker. He lived in a troubled time with people dying and wars being fought, or threatened over religion. He lived during the reign of Queen Elizabeth I, when the question of whether England would be Protestant or Catholic was settled with the new church striving to be the middle way between Geneva, the spiritual home of Calvinism and the Puritans, and Rome, the spiritual home of the Roman Catholic Church.

Richard Hooker helped the new church to understand that her authority was not just from the Bible, as the Puritans claimed. Nor from the Church and Tradition, as the Catholics claimed. Rather, it was Scripture, Reason and Tradition. Anglican often point to this, but sometime miss the main point, which is best asked by asking:

So what?

The point is that Scripture, Reason and Tradition are meant to lead us to salvation, to liberation and not to bondage. Presiding Bishop (PB) Curry has been pointing out that our being the Episcopal branch of the Jesus movement means being loving, liberating and life giving. So also Scripture, Reason and Tradition are meant to lead us into love, freedom and life abundant.

That means that the Bible is meant to lead us into love, freedom and life abundant. Unfortunately, the way that some people use the Bible has been about the opposite, of trying to use scripture to keep people in bondage rather than liberation. Again, PB Curry has been urging us to “recover Jesus”, to let the liberating Jesus of the Gospels out and remind the world that “... the truth will set you free.” The Bible is not just to be studied, but also listened to, meditated upon, to lead us to worship and to that end we do morning prayer and evensong.

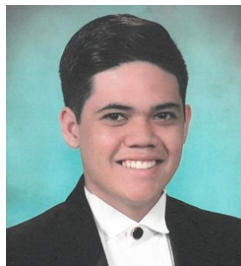
It also means that Reason is meant to lead us into love, freedom and life abundant. The modern world made Reason into its own little god. It denied eternity, wonder and the miraculous and thereby binding us in a secular world where there is no God, or if there is, where God doesn't matter. To the contrary: one of the great Anglicans of the last century, C.S. Lewis reminded us that Reason leads us directly to the mind of the Maker, and there we are released from the tyranny of the modern world to discover that everything is sacramental; a sign that points beyond itself to the creator.

Tradition is also to lead us to love, freedom and life abundant. This is best understood not as small “t” tradition, the customs that come from doing things over and over again. It is rather big “T” Tradition. Tradition (with a big “T”) is not the dead faith of the living, but the living faith of the dead. G.K. Chesterton called tradition “... the democracy of the dead... it is giving your grandmother and grandfather a vote...” It is recognizing the great wisdom of the teachers, saints and mystics of the past. But tradition is a living thing, meant not to bind us up, but to free us from the merely trendy and transient. It is to say that some of the really old things, like the Nicene Creed, and the liturgy and candles, and incense and the Eucharist are where we find love, freedom and life abundant.

But, the most obvious “So What?” Is that our purpose as Christians, as the Church, as the parish of Good Shepherd Episcopal Church here in Wailuku is that we are here not to be good Episcopalians, but rather as followers of Jesus, who seek a world and a Kingdom where there is Love, Liberation and Life.

Jesus comes to us and asks; how much love do you want? Do you want to be free? Do you desire abundant life? Then come and follow me.

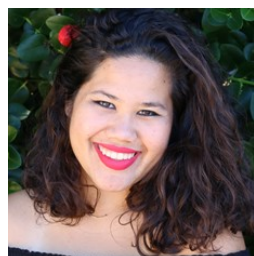

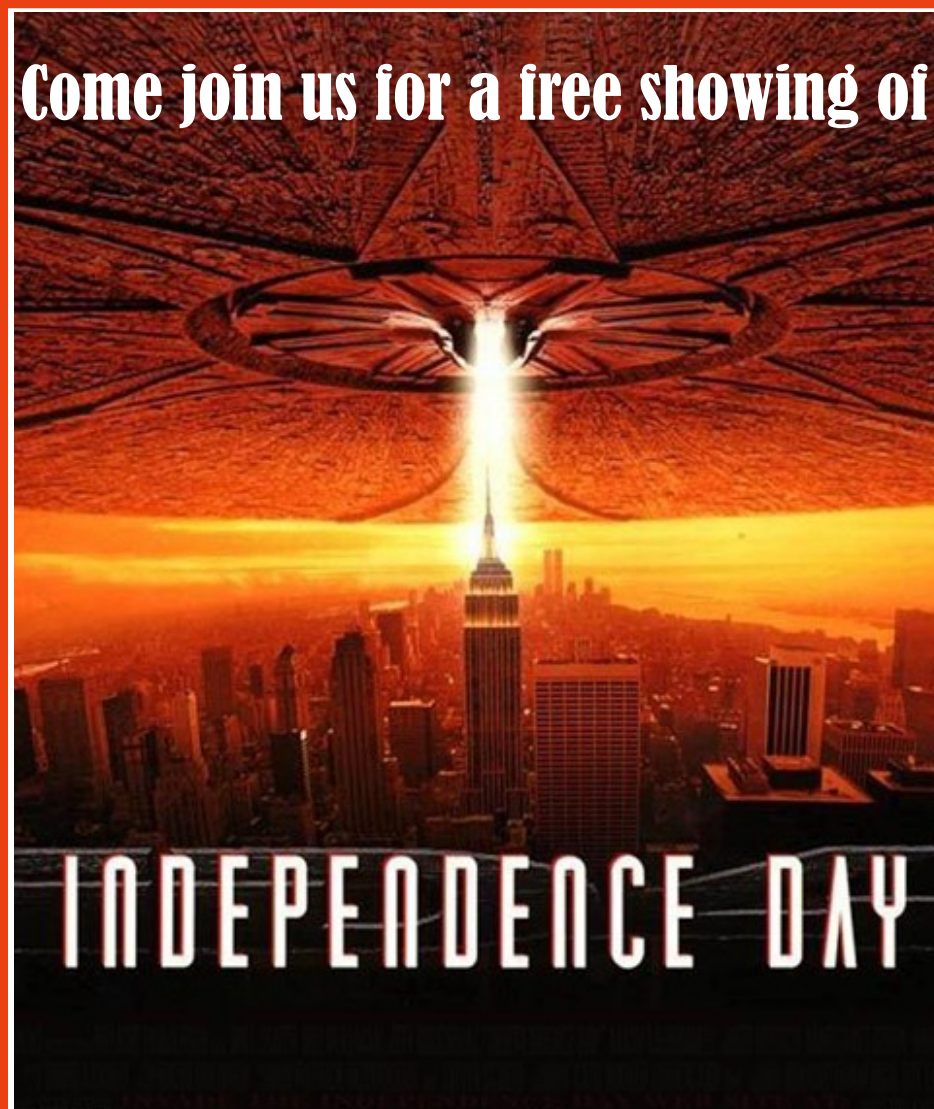
